

The Vancouver Magic Circle became Ring 92 of the International Brotherhood of Magicians 56 years ago on April 21st 1949. **Ian McLeod** is the first and only member of the Vancouver Magic Circle to be awarded the IBM Order of Excalibur Award which is for 50 continuous years of membership. He is also the first living member to receive this award in BC. What an achievement!! As a recap, The IBM was founded in Canada by Len Vintus of Winnipeg in 1922 He was IBM member #1 and the first President of the IBM. Today there are over 300 I.B.M. Rings worldwide, boasting some 14,000 members making it the largest magic organization of its kind in the world.

On July 28th of this year, current and previous executive members of the Vancouver Magic Circle, Ian's son Al McLeod and wife Valerie, daughter Marion and a number of good friends held a gathering to celebrate this momentous occasion. **Ray Medway** open up the festivities with some background information on both Ian and this prestigious award. Vancouver Magic Circle President **Karen Eskilson** offered her personal congratulations and thoughts on this special occasion. She followed by reading out a wonderful and warmly worded letter on this outstanding achievement sent over by

our IBM Territorial Vice President, **Tony Eng**. The coveted Certificate, Pin and Ribbon were then graciously and humorously presented by **David Wilson** with the OOOOOH, AAAAH, Ouch audience participation component fully in tact! All attendees lined up to personally congratulate Ian one at a time. Long time friend **Munro MacKenzie** was feverishly taking notes to capture this occasion. Thanks Munro! Also in attendance were **David Murdoch, Jack Mellor, Eric Lenz, Dennis Chan, David Watters, Trevor Watters,** and **Joe Ward**.

Ian is a past president of the Vancouver Magic Circle (1959) and winner of several prestigious awards that include:

- Ray Gamble Trophy for Best Impromptu Magic with cards
- HB McLean Trophy for Excellence in Close Up Magic
- David Culos Memorial Trophy for the Golden Rabbit Award
- Magic Wand Holders Degree

Ian formally worked in advertising for Woodward's stores and was quite involved with such projects as the \$1.49 Day promotions etc. As many of you are aware, he is a great story teller and always has a clean and funny joke to tell. Story telling comes naturally for Ian, he is a warm caring, giving individual I am proud to have as a friend.

He still attends many of the events put on by the Vancouver Magic Circle every year. Ian is a lifetime member of the Vancouver Magic Circle and will be turning 90 years old in October of this year. His story telling abilities also transfer seamlessly to newspaper and radio as Ian was interviewed by both. Professional and comfortable are words that come to mind when you hear Ian being asked questions.

During interviews with Dan Hilborn of the Burnaby Now Newspaper and the "on air" radio interview with Pryia with "On the Coast" at CBC Radio ... Ian was asked to describe his favourite magic trick. Without hesitation Ian said it was Copentro. They ask him what it is and he replies that the magician shows large glass, a small glass and a wooden base. The small glass is placed on the base and the large glass inverted over the small one. Four coins are shown resting on a stand. One by one the coins **vanish!** And, one by one, they **appear inside the small glass!** Each coin is heard clearly tinkling as it arrives in the small glass. The effect on the audience is truly startling! Each interviewer asks "How is that done?" . "Why of course by magic" says Ian without hesitation once again. His little smile and matter of fact tone let them know that the secrets would not be found out today!

Once again, Congratulations Ian on achieving this most impressive Order of Excalibur!!

In the Spring of 2005 David Watters & **Craig Prystay** were talking about a trophy competition in memory of two VMC Order of Merlin members, **George Patey** and **Bill Eliason**. Together George & Bill brought class to the VMC and years of entertainment to Vancouver including, among other things, the Haunted House at The Pacific National Exhibition.

This will be a Halloween theme competition. Since our October meeting is a busy auction night, it was decided that September would be a great time to see some Halloween magic.

Things came together when **David Wilson** donated a statue given to George and Bill by their good friend Doug Henning, (cousin of the Magician Doug Henning) this statue is of a clown pulling a rabbit out of a hat, how fitting for a Halloween theme. **Craig Prystay** & the Best Western Sands Hotel have offered to have a trophy base built for the statue. Annual keeper trophies will be donated by the Best Western Sands Hotel as well. The trophy is named after a pair of Bill & George's characters who were named Tip-Top and Tootsie, a couple of aristocrat tramps.

Anyone failing to give "24 hours of notice" may now be refused entry into a contest by the trophy chairman.


